K12 IAQ: Programs through EVT

Grant Program

Administered in partnership with AOE

- \$15M of ARPA allocated to AOE for IAQ Grant Program
- Prioritization based on existing conditions
- Two-phased approval process
- EVT provides technical assistance and subgrants
- Projects must be completed by 10/31/2024

Monitoring Program

Administered in partnership with VDH

- VDH contracted with EVT to conduct IAQ research
- 50 schools
- Monitoring equipment, data visualization and specialized reports
- Technical assistance to further hone HVAC upgrades and changes and monitor outcomes
- Initial research through June 2023, with possible extension through 2025

School Indoor Air Quality Grant Program

Efficiency Vermont administers two programs supporting improvements to school indoor air quality:

- 1. The School Indoor Air Quality Grant Program, in partnership with the Agency of Education
- 2. The School Indoor Air Quality Monitoring Program, in partnership with the Department of Health

The **School Indoor Air Quality Grant Program** (Grant Program) provides technical assistance and financial support to public and approved independent schools upgrading HVAC systems to improve indoor air quality in response to COVID-19 guidelines from the American Society of Heating, Refrigeration and Air Conditioning Engineers (ASHRAE). The Grant Program is funded through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) of 2021.

Program funding is limited and will be prioritized based on need, as measured by percentage of a building's square footage currently served by mechanical ventilation. Requirements dictate that installation of HVAC systems in buildings with no mechanical ventilation currently be given first priority. **Projects funded through the Grant Program must be completed by October 31, 2024.**

The **School Indoor Air Quality Monitoring Program** also supports the State's efforts to improve indoor air quality in schools. The Monitoring Program will provide not only monitoring equipment, but also specialized reports on air quality data, and recommended actions to improve indoor air quality based on the monitor data collected. HVAC improvements identified through the Monitoring Program may be eligible for funding through the Grant Program.

superintendents and Heads of School are invited to express interest in either the Grant Program or Monitoring Program, or both Programs, when completing the School Intake Form.

While Intake Forms may be submitted any time, we encourage all interested Superintendents and Heads of School to submit a School Intake Form by March 31, 2022, to be considered in the first round of participant selection in early April. Intake Forms will be re-reviewed and additional participants selected monthly until all funding is allocated.

Concept Approval

- Concept Approval from AOE via the Grants Management System Federal Construction Application
- Subgrant Agreement from EVT

Costs incurred prior to the execution of the Subgrant Agreement are not eligible for reimbursement by grant funds.

- If A&E approved as part of Concept Approval, procure services
- Follow procurement rules for using ARPA funds

Project Approval

- EVT reviews submitted A&E reports, plans, budget, timeline, etc.
- Consultation and technical assistance as needed to refine Project scope
- Project Approval Letter from EVT
- Project Approval from AOE via the Grants Management System Federal Construction Application
- Subgrant Agreement amendment from EVT

Equipment purchases and construction costs incurred prior to Project Approval not eligible for reimbursement by grant funds.

- Approved purchase and construction costs may now be incurred

- Payment must go to SU/D or Independent school (3rd party payments not permitted)
