



Steps to Getting Your Rebate

1. Confirm eligibility. Vermont Gas customers: call 802-863-4511 to determine eligibility. Burlington Electric Department customers: call 802-865-7300.
2. Fill out this form and submit to Efficiency Vermont. (If someone other than homeowner will receive rebate check, see payment section below.)
3. Work with an Efficiency Excellence Network contractor to install qualified measures.
4. Contractor reports completed work to Efficiency Vermont for review.
5. Receive 50% of project costs up to \$2,000 (or complete income verification below for up to \$4,000)

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Eligibility & Exclusions:

Rebate offer is for attic, basement, and/or wall weatherization work performed by an Efficiency Excellence Network contractor in a Vermont home and is subject to change without notice. Incomplete forms may delay or disqualify your rebate. In the event a rebate is discontinued or changed, submissions will be honored at the higher amount if the project was completed prior to the effective date of the change, with rebate submission occurring within 30 calendar days of that date. Allow 60 calendar days for payment after Efficiency Vermont has received confirmation from your contractor of work completed.

Income is defined as the total annual gross income of all family and non-family members 18+ years old living within the household. All sources of income must be counted from all persons in the household based on anticipated income expected within the next 12 months. Possible types of income include but are not limited to: wages, salary, tips, bonuses or commissions payments, public assistance, social security/SSI, child support, regular gifts, unemployment, income earned on assets (savings, IRA, etc.) and some types of financial aid.

Customer is responsible for ensuring that home improvements are installed, operated, and maintained in compliance with all applicable laws, codes, regulations, rules, standards, and manufacturers' instructions. Home improvements for which rebates are paid must comply with Efficiency Vermont program specifications, including minimum air leakage reduction of 10% (as measured by a pre- and post-blower door test), and installation of all recommended health and safety improvements, including but not limited to, mechanical ventilation and carbon monoxide detectors. Projects will be ineligible if vermiculite has been disturbed or knob and tube wiring has not been properly removed or disconnected. Contractors completing projects in homes built before 1978 must adhere to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency requirements for the maintenance and renovation of lead-based painted surfaces and are required to be Lead-Safe Certified Renovators to perform renovation and repair work in areas that disturb lead-based paint. Any exposed foam plastic interior wall covering must be installed in compliance with the 2018 International Residential Code (sections R316.4 through R316.6). Efficiency Vermont conducts site visits for a percentage of homes where rebates were paid to verify that the work performed is consistent with program specifications. They do not encompass and shall not identify violations of any other law, code, or regulation, including but not limited to local building codes. Customer is responsible for ensuring that all home improvements comply with all applicable local building codes in consultation with a local building official when necessary. Efficiency Vermont reserves the right to reclaim any rebates (or portions of rebates) paid in the event it determines the presence of any fraud, misrepresentation, or inaccuracy in the information provided, regardless of whether a verification site visit has been performed.
