- □ Review program requirements below. If you have questions about eligibility, call 888-921-5990.
- Purchase and install a qualifying model. If your new heat pump water heater is not on the qualifying product list (see efficiencyvermont.com/HPWH) it is not eligible for the rebate.
- □ Complete and sign this application.
- □ Submit completed application with W9 (if applicable) and invoice(s) including the quantity, size, type, manufacturer, model or part number, purchase date, and vendor. Submit Declaration of Ownership form if you are a renter.

Program Eligibility and Exclusions

Offer is for residential customers of VT electric utilities, and is subject to change without notice. Rebate can be combined with other Efficiency Vermont offers (including point of purchase discounts). New construction projects are not eligible. Limit: one per household.

Product must be purchased and rebate must be submitted on or after the program/offer "effective date" of 4/1/2024 and within 180 days of the product purchase date. Rebate subject to availability of funds. In the event this rebate is discontinued or changed, submissions will be processed at the new rebate level as of the date of the change, or will not be accepted if the funds are exhausted.

All equipment must be new, installed in Vermont, and listed on the Qualifying Products List (or meet Efficiency Vermont qualifying criteria) at the time of purchase. Used, rebuilt, or refurbished equipment is not eligible. For residential customers only.

For any single item, payment will not exceed the net price to the customer. Net price includes price of the item, shipping, sales tax, installation cost, and disposal/recycling expenses, and must be reduced by any benefits and payments received from insurance, FEMA, and any other donations, Efficiency Vermont programs, or grants.

Customer is responsible for any tax liability associated with rebate payment. Allow 60 calendar days for delivery of payment. Incomplete or missing information will delay processing.

Income Eligibility for Residential Households

Residential customers are eligible to receive this benefit if their household income is at or below the income guidelines. Income is defined as the total annual gross income of all family and non-family members age 18 and over living within the household. To calculate income, take the monthly amount from the last one or two paychecks for yourself and the people in your household (before taxes) and multiply by 12. Include all wages, including regular salaries and overtime. If you are self-employed, use the previous month of pretax income and multiply by 12.

All sources of income must be counted from all persons in the household based on anticipated income expected within the next 12 months. Possible types of income include but are not limited to: wages, salary, tips, bonuses or commissions payments, public assistance, social security/SSI, child support, regular gifts, unemployment, income earned on assets (savings, IRA, etc.) and some types of financial aid.
