Recommended equipment

Service tools

1. Digital multimeter (high voltage)
2. Insulation resistance tester (megohmmeter)
3. Thermal camera
4. OBD-II scanner for EVs
5. Battery lift table
6. Insulated tool sets

Personal protective equipment (PPE)

1. High-voltage gloves
2. Leather gloves (must be able to cover high-voltage gloves)
3. Arc rated face shield
4. Safety goggles
5. Rescue hook
6. Automated External Defibrillator (AED)

EV charging infrastructure

Level 2 or DC Fast Charging stations and the associated electrical infrastructure upgrades

Training and certification

1. EV-specific service training for dealership staff
2. OEM electric vehicle certification
