Recommended equipment

Service tools

- 1. Digital multimeter (high voltage)
- 2. Insulation resistance tester (megohmmeter)
- 3. Thermal camera
- 4. OBD-II scanner for EVs
- 5. Battery lift table
- 6. Insulated tool sets

Personal protective equipment (PPE)

- 1. High-voltage gloves
- 2. Leather gloves (must be able to cover high-voltage gloves)
- 3. Arc rated face shield
- 4. Safety goggles
- 5. Rescue hook
- 6. Automated External Defibrillator (AED)

EV charging infrastructure

Level 2 or DC Fast Charging stations and the associated electrical infrastructure upgrades

Training and certification

- 1. EV-specific service training for dealership staff
- 2. OEM electric vehicle certification
